

KINGS CLIFFE PARISH COUNCIL

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on **11th February 2021** at 7.30 pm by video conference due to the Local Authorities (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority Meetings) (England) Regulations 2020.

<p>District Councillor Roger Glithero – It is with great sadness that we learnt of the passing of Roger on the 26th January 2021. Roger was our District Councillor and had been a great supporter of our Village, particularly the Kings Cliffe Active project and he was an active member of the Planning Committee and he worked closely with the Parish in managing the development of our village.</p> <p>Roger's record of public service is very rare, he had been a District Councillor since 1968, he is believed to be the last Councillors that served on the Old Rural District Council before the Government reorganisation in 1974 and he became our District Councillor some 20 years ago, when his Ward centred on Bulwick was merged with our ward.</p> <p>Dr Nally registered her request to speak in regards to item 20/188 Doctors Surgery. A provision of primary care services email had been circulated to all councillors before the meeting by the Doctors Surgery advising that the Practice intended to close the Surgery in Kings Cliffe in the Summer.</p> <p>Cllr R Brown raised the question presumably the 'business' will be making a substantial cost saving, yet they will still be relying on volunteers to provide transport for those patients unable to get themselves to and from Wansford Surgery. Why isn't this to be funded by the funds raised in the closure of West Street Surgery?</p> <p>Dr Nally confirmed they will visit patients where appropriate and secondly monies raised from the closure of the surgery are fund invested over 30 years ago by herself and Dr Takhar. The subsidies currently received from CCG for the running of West Street will be lost and all staffing will move to Wansford apart from maybe one part-time staff.</p> <p>The Chairman raised the question regarding the old scheme in transporting of patients to and from Wansford which ceased due to the lack of volunteers and changes in insurance etc. Dr Nally confirmed the scheme in Oundle runs very well which Wansford Surgery contribute towards the costs of the scheme and will contribute more over the coming years as it becomes more used. They may look for more volunteers from Kings Cliffe to cover this service.</p> <p>The Chairman raised the question of car-sharing given that the surgery will be due to close in Summer 2021 and given the current pandemic and advise and restrictions, how will the car-sharing working given these restrictions. Dr Nally reassured that the scheme is still working effectively in Oundle and will continue and home visit are still being carried out for those needing them.</p> <p>Cllr R Meadows raised the question on the use of Kings Cliffe Active and Dr Nally confirmed that most of the work there will be more proactive providing services covering exercises offer for both young and old of all abilities. A possible Room with a scheme to book online consultations, access will be good with parking as the room will be on the lower floor. Other activities to support health, low-level mental health support and a prescription pick-up service are under discussion. Although the prescription pick-ups maybe best being delivered.</p> <p>Concerns over the consultation and some parishioners were under the impression that the Surgery was just moving all the services to Kings Cliffe Active and not just offering certain services. It was an informal meeting about the facilitation of retaining the Doctors Surgery and Services within Kings Cliffe.</p> <p>The Parish Council would regret the decision made by the Doctors to close the West Street Surgery. The Parish Council felt the consultation circulated gave a misinterpretation of their intentions as it indicated moving their services to Kings Cliffe Active.</p> <p>Councillors felt a further consultation needed to take place. It was decided a Facebook Poll should be undertaken over 10 days to give the Parish Council an idea of the parishioners understanding of the Doctor's Surgery closure, relocation, services offered, this will also cover those parishioners that didn't receive or complete the first consultation circulated. Councillors to email questions for the poll and then a further meeting to be arranged to discuss the outcome of the Poll.</p> <p>It was also stated that the Surgery should remain open until negotiations with KCA or an alternative location is agreed upon.</p> <p>20/189 KCPC Emergency Plan NCC Emergency Planning Office is currently looking over the draft plan and will then advise on emergency equipment.
